


Analysis of Canvass of Candidates 2016

This analysis is based on the responses from 61 candidates to four questions regarding the future use of the Ōtākaro red zone. This involved some interpretation of responses into a number of possible categories - this is by necessity a subjective process, however we have attempted to be as objective as possible.

Question 1: Do you support a multipurpose city-to-sea River Park that meets diverse community needs eg for environmental regeneration and restoration; recognition of cultural and community heritage; play, recreation and sport; food production; arts and entertainment; learning, training, employment, small business and tourism?


Do you support a multipurpose city-to-sea River Park that meets diverse needs

While allowing for multiple uses, do you support the maximum possible restoration of native ecosystems within the Ōtākaro Red Zone


